VICKSBURG, Miss.—The Railway Tie Association (RTA) hosted a sold-out Tie Grading Seminar March 10-13 in College Station, Texas. The Koppers Inc. treating facility in nearby Somerville served as the host plant.

The seminar serves as one of RTA's premier educational events for the wood crosstie industry and is designed to educate new, current and tenured industry personnel on tie grading in railroad applications.
