RTA Readies For Conference On The Shores Of Lake Tahoe

Registration is now open for the Railway Tie Associations (RTA) 95th Annual Symposium and Technical Conference, scheduled for Oct. 9-11, in Incline Village, Nev.

The host hotel for this conference is the Hyatt Regency Lake Tahoe Resort, Spa & Casino, with a negotiated room rate starting at \$179 per night.

The conference will kick off on Wednesday, Oct. 9 with the annual RTA Golf Tournament at the Championship Golf Course designed by Robert Trent Jones. The Championship Course offers tightly cut fairways, bordered by towering pines, demanding accuracy as well as distance. Golfers are faced with bunkered greens and lateral water hazards on almost every hole. Challenging, to say the least.

Considered by many to be one the top golf courses in the West, the Championship Course was listed by *Golfweek* Magazine as the #8 Best Course You Can Play in Nevada in 2013.

Should weather not cooperate, golfers are invited to enjoy a blackjack clinic at The Casino Royale followed by an actual tournament with chips. A slot tournament will also be part of the event for all those interested.

Later, the annual President's Cocktail Reception will be held at the home of railroad executive and real estate developer Kern Schumacher on Lake Tahoe. The reception is sponsored by A&K Railroad Materials. Shuttles will be available at 5:15 p.m., in front of the hotel to take you to his home.

Schumacher started coming to Lake Tahoe in the 1950s and bought a property in the then-sleepy town of Incline Village in 1971, attracted to "the combination of beauty and low taxes," according to an article in the *Wall Street Journal*.

The article continued, "On what's now considered a prime lakefront spot on prestigious Lakeshore Boulevard, Mr. Schumacher built a 12,900-square-foot contemporarystyle house, restored an existing 1952 guesthouse and added another guesthouse. His

property has a pier with eight boat lifts, a tennis court, a beach volleyball court, a creek and two ponds stocked with trout."

Lunch will be served in the exhibit hall followed by a keynote address from Terry




One of the optional activities at this year's conference includes a chocolate and wine-pairing lesson at the resort, where attendees will be shown the basic techniques for creating world-class truffles.

Following Jones' presentation, sessions will continue and address legislative issues, provide an update on AREMA and give details of major engineering projects Class 1 railroads have undertaken recently or will in the future.

The evening will end with the Annual RTA Banquet and Awards Ceremony. Themed, "The All Black (and a Little Gold) Nevada Party," this event encourages attendees to deck out in their most elegant black and gold eveningwear.

Friday will kick off with the Research Forum, where attendees will learn more about the effects of borate and creosote treatments on electrical resistance properties of wood crossties. This will be followed by a variety of presentations addressing creosote absorption through the skin; European manufacturing capabilities for custom creosotes; a report on EPA submittal and an update on Boiler MACT Rules for creosote ties; an update on ACZA testing and usage; ongoing work at TTCI in FAST heavy haul applications; and how to grow a cleaner tomorrow by turning cellulose into hydrogen power.

Judd Johnson, president of *Hardwood Market Report*, will provide an update on hardwood markets.

The conference will close with the highly anticipated Railroad Purchasing Forum, during which Class 1 railroad representatives share with attendees their expected purchases for the coming year.

During the evening hours, attendees will be able to continue networking with colleagues at sponsored hospitality suites.
