SUBJECT: 94th Annual RTA Technical Conference & Symposium in Tampa, FL

The current location of Tampa was once inhabited by indigenous people of the Safety Harbor culture, most notably the Tocobaga and the Pohoy, who lived along the shores of Tampa Bay. The town grew slowly until the 1880's, when railroad links, the discovery of phosphate, and the arrival of the cigar industry jump-started Tampa's development and helped it grow into an important city by the early 1900's. One of the most anticipated events in Tampa is the Gasparilla Pirate Festival, a mock pirate invasion held since 1904. Often referred to as Tampa's "Mardi Gras", the invasion flotilla is led by the pirate ship, "Jose Gasparilla" and contributes a vast amount to the city's economy.
